
Reports to Inform Decision Making


Over our long history of working with health centers, Capital Link has amassed an enormous amount of national data on the health center industry, particularly financial and operational data. We maintain a database of almost 10,000 health center audited financial statements and Uniform Data System information from 2005-2017, incorporating approximately 75% of all health centers nationally in any given year. This proprietary database is the only one of its kind and enables us to create analytical data reports to help health centers understand and improve their financial and operational performance and prepare for changing reimbursement models.

Make Data Driven Decisions with Performance Evaluation Profiles (PEPs)

Deep understanding of the financial and operational performance of your member health centers leads to informed decision-making. *PEPs* provide insight with multi-year trends and peer comparisons on 73 financial and operational performance metrics. PCAs in approximately 20 states have used *PEPs* to provide their members with data to drive action.

Sustainability and Growth Planning

[State and Local Market Assessments](#) analyze service areas in geographic, demographic, and economic terms, helping health centers evaluate and determine current and future patient needs.



[Scenario Modeling](#) helps forecast the impact of changing patient care models and revenues based on payment reform. Evaluating potential scenarios helps health centers better plan for impacts on operations, including patient utilization, care delivery, and service offerings.

[Strategic Planning Facilitation](#) walks health centers through the process of assessing key opportunities and challenges, identifying environmental influences, examining operating systems, establishing objectives, mobilizing staff and other stakeholders, and distilling information into actions, using our toolkit.

[Advancing Financial & Operational Strength](#) provides health center staff at all levels with in-depth training and resources related to financial and operational benchmarking; revenue cycle management; aligning people, place and process; capital planning; and performance improvement (to name a few) to improve business operations and financial health. The program launched in 2015 in California and has expanded to Missouri, Massachusetts, Tennessee, and West Virginia.
